The Pastor's Corner

My dear Parishioners,

Had he lived, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. would have celebrated his 85th birthday this past Thursday. Every once in a while I find myself wondering what this country would have been like if he had lived. What changes would have taken place here or in the world because of his influence? Would he have run for public office? Would he have been elected president? Or would he have remained the eloquent and prophetic Baptist preacher, the mesmerizing weaver of words, moving always forward, encouraging and challenging younger generations to get outside of themselves and do something for others? What impact would he have continued to make on his friends and foes for, to be sure, he would still have had both?

Perhaps the better thing to do as we celebrate his birthday is to question ourselves: "How have I allowed the meaning of Martin Luther King, Jr.'s life to affect my own life as an American and as a Christian?"

For me personally, as a member of the clergy, I find it most helpful at this time every year to reread Dr. King's "*Letter from the Birmingham City Jail*," written in response to eight predominantly white clergymen who criticized his involvement in civil rights demonstrations in Birmingham. He had been jailed because of this on Good Friday in 1963. His powerful and profound response set them and the nation straight about the Civil Rights movement. Today all Americans need to be challenged again by that message.

New Congregational Hymnal for a New Year!

The 2nd Edition of *Lead Me Guide Me* hymnal is now in use. **Please note that we are following a new procedure with the new hymnals. As you enter the church, you will be given your hymnal by a Minister of Hospitality and you are asked to return your hymnal to a Minister of Hospitality before you depart the church. No hymnals are to be left in the pews.** This may take a bit of an adjustment, but our intention is to safeguard the hymnals and maintain them in good condition. Your cooperation is essential and appreciated.

On the front inside page of the hymnal, you will find a label indicating the person or persons to whose memory or in whose honor that hymnal has been dedicated as well as the name of the donor. May we suggest that you offer a prayer for those persons?

As you page through the 2nd edition of *Lead Me Guide Me*, you will note some differences in comparison with the 1st edition. For example, the music for several new Masses suited for community participation has been included. Some old familiar hymns are missing but a variety of newer hymns is spread throughout the book waiting to be sung.

The Worship Commission spearheaded the purchase of our new hymnals as part of our commemoration of the 60th anniversary of the parish. **If you have not yet donated a hymnal you may still do so by contacting a member of the Worship Commission or a Minister of Hospitality. Domingo 2 del Tiempo Ordinario/B

Mis queridos Hermanos: en la fiesta del Bautismo del Señor, escuchamos junto al Jordán la voz del Padre que nos invitaba a reconocer a Jesús como su Hijo amado. Hoy veremos como empiezan a acercarse algunos de los que serán sus discípulos. Queremos escucharle y queremos alimentarnos de su Palabra y del Pan de Vida, La Eucaristía.

- * **1 Samuel 3, 3-19;** El autor sagrado nos dice **como Dios llama** a quienes quiere encargar una misión. Y escuchamos también un gran ejemplo de **respuesta dedicada y fiel.**
- * **En la segunda lectura,** San Pablo en su carta a los Corintios, nos habla de un tema a veces muy olvidado: **la importancia de preservar la dignidad de nuestro cuerpo.**
- * **San Juan,** en el breve pasaje que nos manifiesta señala, en primer lugar a Jesús **“como el Cordero de Dios”.** El **seguimiento** que hacen sus discípulos que escuchan a Juan, **pero siguen a Jesús.** Finalmente, **la experiencia que viven.** A la pregunta **¿ Dónde vives?** La respuesta es **“Venid y lo veréis”.** Esto es tan fuerte e impactante que hasta recuerdan la hora, **“eran las cuatro de la tarde”.**
- * **Conclusión:** Entre otras podemos señalar, que confesarlo como Mesías, nos lleva al compromiso de anunciarlo en la cotidianidad de la vida: con la familia, amigos, trabajo, etc. etc. Un segundo punto es tomar conciencia que Dios nos acompaña en nuestro caminar. Hemos escuchado que **“Jesús se volvió y, al ver que lo seguían, les pregunta: ¿Que buscáis?”** Son las primeras palabras de Jesús en el evangelio de Juan; una pregunta que, en la plenitud de resucitado, volverá a hacer a Maria Magdalena. Nosotros no podemos seguir el mismo ritmo de Dios; por eso el siempre va delante nuestro, porque es él quien toma siempre la iniciativa de una manera sorprendente: se para, se vuelve para mirarnos, nos cuestiona y nos habla.

Finalmente, Jesús nos invita a estar con El. Es la invitación a la amistad con el Hijo de Dios. A ir con él a todas partes: También a la cruz y a la resurrección. Ellos fueron y compartieron con él. Fue la experiencia mas grande que pudieron vivir y los marcó para siempre.

Mis Hermanos, hagamos esa experiencia de comunión de vida con Jesús. El nos puede transformar en sus verdaderos testigos. Este será nuestro gran testimonio. Caminemos con El.
